Providence to Start Venturing Crew

Venturing is a youth development program of the Boy Scouts of America for young men and women who are 14 (and have completed the eighth grade) through 20 years of age. Venturing's purpose is to provide positive experiences to help young people mature and to prepare them to become responsible and caring adults. Venturing is based on a unique and dynamic relationship between youth, adult leaders, and organizations in their communities. Local community organizations establish a Venturing crew by matching their people and program resources to the interests of young people in the community. The result is a program of exciting and meaningful activities that helps youth pursue their special interests, grow, develop leadership skills, and become good citizens.

Plans are already underway for a new Venturing Crew at Providence that will begin meeting this summer. The crew will initially meet two times per month in the evenings and then probably switch to one time per month once the crew is organized and running efficiently. The goal is to plan out at least one high adventure outing each year such as caving, white water rafting, kayaking, etc. Membership in a Venturing crew is a great opportunity for networking and obtaining the bronze, gold or silver award is a great addition to a young person's resume or college application.
